New GSSC Board is Sworn in; Seward Receives Award of Merit

Led by President Ray Mendonsa, the new board of directors for 2008-09 was sworn in at the Sept. 20 general meeting, held in conjunction with the annual picnic and championship playoff games at the Sacramento Softball Complex.

The club also honored Dick Seward with the 2008 Award of Merit, the 40th recipient of the honor, formerly known as Man of the Year, in the 30-year GSSC history.

Mendonsa, elected at the August meeting, succeeds Dan Norton, who did not seek another term in the office. Also sworn in were re-elected board members Pete Ward (second vice president in charge of uniforms), Glen Cole (treasurer), Mickey Schleicher (secretary), and Tom Sansone (player agent). Dave Vargo, formerly first vice president, takes over as club commissioner. Freddie Miller did not seek re-election to that post. Fred Fischer is the newly elected first vice president, in charge of sponsorships. Members applaud Norton and Miller for their hard work and dedication.

In brief remarks, Mendonsa reiterated that the club belongs to the members and urged their attendance and participation at meetings as rules for the next season are discussed and decided. He said he wants to see greater uniformity in rules among the (See Page 3)

### MOST LEAGUE TITLE GAMES ARE ONE-RUN CLIFF-HANGERS

With four of six games decided by one run, the winners. Behind Peter Anagnoston's pitching, Picnic Day league championship games were an exciting and entertaining blend of good pitching, mostly tight defense and timely hitting.

In the **League 5** title game, California Energy edged Overhead Door 4-3. A 4-6-3 doubleplay in the fifth inning ending a bases-loaded Overhead Door threat after the winners broke a 1-1 tie with three runs, mainly due to errors in a game that otherwise featured outstanding defensive play. The losers were led by Ettore Minor, who homered over the right-fielder's head in the sixth. He also made a great catch to rob California Energy's Allen Riker of a hit. League 2: Fourth-seeded Harper Properties, managed by Jim Wait, used Jim Lucas' gamewinning hit for a come-from-behind 16-15 victory over second-seeded Sports Leisure Vacations. Rich Edwards homered for the

Harper Properties shut out Sports Leisure in the final two innings.

League 4: Fourth-seed C&C Plumbing, managed by Jack Kocunik, edged Russ Barnes' defending champion Bradshaw Ranch Golf, 15-14. Four two-out hits -- by Bob Smartt, Dave Tanner, Ed Frantz and Bruce Gilmore -- keyed a five-run sixth-inning rally for the winners. C&C's Rich Ganas' towering drive reached the trees beyond the left-field fence. It was the lone over-the-fence blast of the six Picnic Day league championship playoff finals. C&C, league leader with 16 double plays in the regular season, added three more in the playoffs.

### Two Reach .800 Plateau

Only two Golden Seniors wound up the regular season breaking the .800 batting average barrier: Bill Christian (.847) and Monte Miller (.821). (Vargo noted that he would have been there if playoff games were included.)
