TEAMS ARE SET AND RARIN' TO GO FOR 2009 AS CLUB ROSTER LISTS 522 GOLDEN SENIORS

Player drafts were conducted in February for 43 teams in seven leagues as the GSSC roster for 2009 totals 522 members, including non-playing members, compared to 487 last year. However, Assistant Secretary Henry Low noted in his Feb. 23 report that 35 members who failed to renew would soon be dropped from the roster, making 2009's overall roster about the same size as last year. (The 2009 roster was still being adjusted with late signups at this writing.)

Single-league signups totaled 409 players. There were 113 players signed up for more than one league, filling 246 team roster spots. In 2008, 93 multi-leaguers filled 210 team roster spots. The multiple leaguers include "Super Ironmen" Greg Leurgans and Bill McMahon, who signed up to play in five leagues. They turn 60 this year to qualify for back-to-back 60-and-over Tuesday morning leagues, plus the three 50-and-over night leagues. Greg also is a L5 manager and Bill is a L3 assistant manager. (They'd have to be 70 or older to play in the two other GSSC leagues, so, in 2019 ...)

It will be interesting to follow scores and won-loss records of the six teams on Tuesday night as L3's experimental drafting process plays out. The six managers agreed on balanced teams, then had a draw for the teams. No team could be "stacked" in advance because none of the managers knew which team they'd have. A.J. Petruzzi touted this format more than a year ago, patterned after his experience with a league in Lodi that resulted in a very competitive season for all teams. With Commish Jerry Toenyes presiding, Manager Brent Korff burned the midnight oil to pump out a series of drafts. (See Vargo's column for more details on L3 and L7 drafts.)

Practice games for L2-7 are scheduled to begin the week of March 17. The regular season starts the week of March 30, The bell rings for real on March 16 for the enlarged League 1.

CARE FOR UNIFORM SHIRTS WILL MAKE THEM LAST LONGER, SAVE \$\$\$

Pete Ward, 2nd vice president in charge of uniforms, offers these tips for keeping your GSSC jersey in good shape: How jerseys are laundered causes more loss than wearing them in games. When T-shirts are worn under jerseys, they may not need washing after each game. When washing, turn it inside out to protect its latex lettering from washing machine agitation. Never use bleach; it harms the colors. Use detergent made for colors. Wash with other colored items that will not bleed their colors onto the jersey. Never use hot water; it melts the latex lettering and fades the colors. Bleach or hot water with lettering turned outside can wear out a new jersey in one season. Hang to dry to avoid long tumbling in a hot dryer. If it must go in a dryer, use a cooler setting. #

DUGOUT CHATTER DISTRIBUTION

With this March issue of the Dugout Chatter, we switch to the more efficient distribution strategy that we inaugurated in 2008. To make it work, we need the cooperation of all hands, especially league commissioners, team managers and league scorekeepers.

We achieve two important goals through reduced use of regular mail: We cut our postage expense and we get the Dugout Chatter to members in a more timely manner -- when it is still news they can use. We cannot continue to use the standard mail system that brings the newsletter to mailboxes two or three weeks after it is actually published and put online. And it would break the bank to send every member a first-class postage copy every month.

This is how we communicate vital information to club members: We utilize electronic and print newsletters, our web site and our telephone hotline (491-1721) operated by Don Shank.

For the growing majority of members with Internet access our web site (www.gsscs.org) should be the way to go year-round to read the latest Dugout Chatter. Past DC issues and other information are provided on the web site, including safety-relayed information and rule books, photos and player applications. The site's master is Jamyn Jodice, who deserves credit for an outstanding job.

For the September-October, November-December, January and February issues, all members receive the Dugout Chatter via regular mail -- unless they are on record as requesting that they NOT receive it that way because they prefer to read the DC online and save the club postal expense.

The vast majority of members, for the months of March, April, May, June, July and August, will read their Dugout Chatter online or, if they lack Internet access, pick up a copy at practices (during March) or games during the season. Ask your manager. Check with the scorekeeper. Copies should be available at the Complex (from managers or scorekeepers) or at the L1 Howe Avenue game site.

As we did last year, all non-playing life members were automatically maintained on the list to receive the Dugout Chatter via regular mail -- unless they notify me (coachrwr@comcast.net) with Dugout Chatter in the subject line, or phone me at 422-2500 that they'd rather get their newsletter online. Sponsors will continue to receive the newsletter via the mail.

Our electronic communication chain is useful in the timely electronic distribution strategy: When it is online, I notify the Board of Directors. This message is relayed to league commissioners. They relay the message to the managers, who, in turn, notify their players, usually via a relay of the same message to a group e-mail to team members. Lou Coppola is responsible for providing copies to L1 managers on Mondays. Jim Wait brings copies to L2 managers or scorekeepers on Tuesdays, and scorekeepers get them to managers/players for leagues 3-7. As editor, I appreciate the help of all to make this work. -- Ron Roach.
