#### DAVE VARGO'S COMMISSIONER CORNER

Thanks to League 1 players Benny Benson and Sam Rispoli for taking on scorer duties on Tuesday mornings for Leagues 2/6/7.

After the first week of play, there have already been nine day- and 18 anight-league replacement player assignments.

Select 70 League 7 Team #3 (Hooters) needed replacements for Manager Al Tirapelli and three other players, getting four replacements in one week. Thanks to Henry Low and Tony DiBernardo for serving as acting manager. Select 60 L6 defending champ GSSA lost its manager, Noel Maldonado, for seven games due to travel and assistant manager (the commish) for the year due to knee problems, (See Page 5)

#### SENIOR SOFTBALL USA WOOS GSSCS (From Page 1)

GSSCS, which has had to raise its player fees to cover increases in field rentals at the Sacramento Softball Complex, has been denied permission to use non-ASA certified bats or better balls at the Sacramento Softball Complex, describing it as an insurance issue.

SSUSA President Terry Hennessy (a GSSCS member who plays in League 5) and Steve Simmons, clubs and leagues national director, briefed the board and the general membership on the advantages of their organization, including insurance coverage. Hennessy said the 21-year-old SSUSA is "a senior organization. That's our speciality. That's what we do." It is "dedicated to helping all senior clubs and leagues maintain their independence and grow."

SSUSA is the sanctioning body for the Northern California Senior Softball Association, supplying insurance and rules which allow use of high-performance bats and equipment that are banned at the Sacramento Softball Complex, based on ASA restrictions. Hennessy stated that the complex's ASA-related restrictions are driven by the dimensions of fields, not safety issues.

Meanwhile, the board authorized Club Commissioner Dave Vargo to solicit quotes from other softball venues in the area to compare with rates charged at the Sacramento Complex. Vargo reported that he expects to have rate quotes from at least three facilities within a month or so. GSSCS President Ray Mendonsa said the board will not act on either a shift in facilities or a move away from ASA without surveying the feelings of members. "The bulk of the membership must support a move from the Complex to more reasonable-priced facilities and a switch in governance, such as USSSA versus ASA, that would give GSSCS freedom to play by its own equipment rules." Two surveys will be prepared, one for Tuesday day leagues and one for night leagues, Mendonsa said.

In other action, the board agreed to publish a notice in the Dugout Chatter to encourage members to step forward and declare interest in running for board positions and serving in appointive posts, such as league commissioner and team manager roles.

Player Agent Tom Sansone reported the club has 522 members, of whom 67 are new. Eight members have dues outstanding, but this number is down from 15 over two weeks.

All leagues except Tuesday nights need additional players for their waiting lists. Sansone said, "Any club member interested in playing in the day leagues or on nights (Wednesday and Thursday) is encouraged to contact me. We can get members onto teams in short order." #
