REST IN PEACE: ART. AUGIE, BILL, ARLENE, KATIE

Life Member Art Granum, 87, a Golden Seniors original who played or managed in the club for almost 30 years, passed away on June 23. Art joined the club on March 15, 1981, when he played for the Gold Dusters. He also played with the Graduates, first managed by Walt King, according to Joe Kline and Joe Moreno. "Art was a fine-fielding first-baseman, playing in many national tournaments," said Kline.

After playing in a 1994 regional tournament, having played nine games in four days, Graduates teammates gathered at a Reno bar when Art had a stroke and was rushed to a hospital. He then was confined to a wheel chair. Ernie Kidwell or Hi Witt would transport Art to Monday games so he could be with his ball-playing friends, according to Lou Coppola.

George Hodsdon wrote that Art was a "real tribune to the Golden Seniors." A memorial service -- celebration of Art's life -- was scheduled for July 16 in Sacramento (10:30 a.m. at the North Sacramento Funeral Home on El Camino Ave).

Life Member Augie Sorgea, 68, passed away on June 11. He had not played in eight years since suffering a major stroke. His life membership was awarded when club directors decided to recognize Augie's contributions to the club. An outstanding pitcher, Augie joined the GSSCS in June 1993. He was the athletic director at the Capital Christian Center and played Tuesday nights with the Golden Seniors until 2001. (See Page 2)

Bill Hill, night league player, manager and sponsor, and Tom Sansone, current player agent and day leagues player, are seeking the club presidency. Ray Mendonsa is not seeking a third one-year term. (Note: See Pages 5-6 for background information on new nominees, particularly on the only contested office.)

Fred Fischer is not a candidate for another term as first vice president, and the lone nominee for this post is Richard Latimer. After one year as club commissioner, Bob Smartt withdrew upon Bruce Gilmore's sudden declaration of candidacy during the July 12 meeting. Linda McCollum Greene is the lone nominee for player agent.

The club's nominating chairman, John Mizerak, said Glen Cole agreed to run again for club treasurer as no one else would step forward. Incumbent Second Vice President Pete Ward and Secretary George Lamb are up for re-election. They also had expressed willingness to move aside and give others an opportunity to serve. None did. In fact. Mizerak said he couldn't find anyone to serve with him on the nominating committee and would be thinking hard ("cogitating") on whether he wants to do this again.

Thus at least three and as many as four of those elected in August will be new to the seven-member board that must deal with budget issues and a dire need to recruit more players, particularly among the those turning into their fifties who could fill rosters of Wednesday and Thursday night leagues. The club came seriously close to dropping the Thursday night league for 2010 and (See Page 4)

extended deadlines and made one-time fee incentives to attract enough players to field six teams.

(Further nominations may come from the floor at the Aug. 9 meeting as long as the additional nominees are present.)

CLUB MEMBERSHIP FEES. Membership fees were increased for 2010, and the club appears to be looking at a \$5,000 surplus -- still precariously low -- to begin the next fiscal year on Oct. 1, according to a financial report at the July 12 meeting.

The club's Planning Committee met July 12 and reported to the board the following recommendation for 2011 fees: Committee member and spokesman Dave Vargo told the board that the fee structure would be "revenue neutral" if day league fees are reduced by \$10 and night league fees are increased by \$5. All players choosing to play in second or third leagues would see increases of \$5 for each additional league.

Data compiled by Henry Low illustrate that night leagues -- particularly Thursday nights when the Complex charges higher field rentals -- are more expensive than the day leagues. Vargo also said the board could consider drafts in the second week of March, about a month or so later than usual, and have just one preseason meeting to hand out shirts, caps and schedules, and perhaps have some batting/fielding practice, instead of formal practice games. The club reduced the practice schedule in recent years, and had a two-game schedule last March. The regular season could start in the second week of April. The board will consider recommendations at meetings in August. Player Agent Sansone said it is essential that the current board nail down details required to prepare player applications for circulation in September. (Note: League 1 on Mondays added teams and needed to play more games that count, so its regular season opens in

March without any practice games. Of course, older players tend to practice through the winter, weather permitting, to stay in shape.)

The board agreed that current club members should be notified that there will be a hard deadline of Dec. 1 for renewals and that the Thursday night league would not be offered if signups are too few. There also was some discussion about moving the Thursday night league to Monday nights, if such a move would be favored by enough members.

NEW SAFETY LEADER. In other actions, the board approved Mendonsa's appointment of Curtis Holcomb to succeed the late Jerry Jodice as club safety coordinator and expressed the need to continue the training of club members in CPR/AED. Holcomb is currently the L-2 commissioner and L-2 safety coordinator. The board also approved the creation of the Jerry Jodice Safety Fund within the club's annual budget to make sure there is funding to maintain the club's "Crash Carts" -- including defibrillators -- at club game sites and continued Red Cross training for club "red hat" qualifiers.

MAKEUP GAMES. The board decided to have makeup games the week of Aug. 3, with league commissioners deciding which rainout to make up. The club will use the July 20-21 dates, which became open at the Complex, to make up games canceled the week of July 6 due to failure of the Complex water pump and water pipes.

TEAM PICTURES AND RIVERCATS TICKETS. Lou Coppola, entertainment chair, said members interested in tickets to Rivercats games should contact him at 444-6138. Golden Seniors members who want team pictures need to tell their managers. Pictures cost \$3 each.

GSSCS WEBMASTER. Communications chair Ron Roach told the club that Jamyn Jodice, who worked with his father to provide the club's first Web site, wants to continue as the volunteer webmaster. Roach said there is still need for a volunteer or two to help Jamyn, especially as the club expands the site with more current club news

CLUB PUBLICIST. The club still needs volunteers to help Coppola and board members recruit new players. #

INFORMATION ON NEW BOARD NOMINEES FOR AUG. 9 ELECTION

Tom Sansone, 62, has been a member of Golden Seniors since 2002, mainly on Tuesday nights for six years before switching to Tuesday days upon turning 60 and in retirement. This is his second year of playing in both the 9 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Tuesday leagues.

He is in his third season as club player agent, responsible for preparing player applications and correspondence, as well as lists for league drafts and the waiting lists for substitutes.

"Performing the job of the Player Agent has been a large responsibility but I think the most rewarding part of the job has been sitting on the Board and sharing the administrative and policy responsibilities of running the Club. In my previous life, I was a manager and an administrator. Over the years, I developed some skills in building consensus, system organization and goal setting. I believe I have been able to use these skills while participating on the Board these last three years. These are probably the most important skills I can bring to the position of President." As a club member, Tom said he wants to serve as president based on "a value I have: 'Commit to Participate' in an active role to help the club become a source for exercise, camaraderie, friendly competition and fun. I want the Golden Seniors to be a strong, viable organization and I will commit time and energy to that end." #

Bill Hill, 57, joined the Golden Seniors in November of 2004 and is in his sixth year as a League 5 (Thursday night) player and fourth year as a League 4 (Wednesday night) player. He sponsors teams in both leagues, manages on Thursday and is the co-manager on Wednesday. He has worked in the family business (California Energy Service) for 40 years. The company does Home Improvements and Energy Conservation.

Bill is currently President and plays in the 190-player South Placer Senior Softball Club in Roseville. He is finishing his two-year term this season. He served as the Treasurer for one year before that. He has played in the league for eight years. The club plays on Tuesday nights and has 50+ and 60+ age divisions. Bill noted his term is over in August and he no longer will be on the board of the South Placer league so there would be no conflict if elected.

Bill has stated that if elected he will work hard on getting (new) and retaining (existing) players to the various Golden Senior leagues. He said he will call every player if he has to. Bill would like to expand the night leagues to eight teams each while maintaining quality. He will fight for the Golden Seniors to get the best possible equipment available, including the balls we use.

Bill said as President he would work to maintain and improve the quality of the club. "It is every player's duty to give back to the league in some way, and I want to play in this club for years to come. It is a critical time for the league and I feel I can take it to the next level." #
