GSSCS DIRECTORS APPROVE BETTER BALL FOR 2011

Directors of the Golden Seniors Softball Club of Sacramento decided Jan. 10 to upgrade to a betterperforming ball for the 2011 season. The Stote Trump Evil ball, according to League President Bill Hill, will provide members more "bang for a buck."

While still within the ASA-approved limit of .44-core, 375-compression, it was described as a top-of-the-line ball with more (and tighter) stitching in the leather cover. The ball costs about \$1 more, adding about \$500 to the equipment budget for 400 balls.

Umpire-in-Chief Freddie Miller led members at the general meeting in a round of applause for Pete Ward, the club's second vice president who has devoted so much time testing various balls to come up with one that would please the members. There have been complaints about balls provided by the Sacramento Softball Complex that were of such poor quality that many wellstruck balls would die in the outfield.

President Hill and others have commented that a number of GSSCS members have threatened to leave the club and play elsewhere because of the "dead" balls supplied by the Complex. Finding a better ball has been a top priority of the president and his 2010-11 Board of Directors.

In other news from the Jan. 10 general meeting, Hill said he has been informed that the Complex has acquired a bat-testing machine to make sure that bats used at the Complex do not exceed ASA limits. He said that even the "grandfathered" Easton Synergy would be disallowed if it fails the test.

Schedule and Rules: The board plans a special meeting, on Jan. 17, to discuss proposed rules and the 2011 playing schedule, including the possibility that the date of the September picnic could be earlier in the month and the regular season could begin earlier, in March, to avoid conflict with the annual senior softball tournament in Oregon on the third weekend of September. the Complex that might allow the club more flexibility in its scheduling. It is likely that the number of practice games will be reduced to just one.

The board also said it needed to discuss Rules Committee proposals for rules dealing with player substitutions for playoffs and base-running. The run-through rule for all leagues will remain in effect, Hill said, while the board will consider a Rules Committee recommendation, via Club Commissioner Bruce Gilmore, to create 10-foot "V" lines for those running to second and third bases. He said such lines have been used in L-1 and in Lincoln Hills to reduce risk of injury from baserunner-fielder collisions.

Gilmore said a 2011 Rule Book will be published, incorporating rules to be acted upon and announced at the next general meeting (Feb. 7), as well as some rule changes that were adopted in 2010, when a Rule Book update was not published.

Draft dates for the leagues will be announced soon, as well as details for tryouts for new club members or players transferring to a new league.

2011 General Meeting Schedule: A meeting schedule for the rest of the year also was announced: Feb. 7, March 14, May 16, July 11, Aug. 15 and at the September picnic/ playoffs Saturday. The dates are pending confirmation of availability of the VFW Post 67 hall on Stockton Boulevard.

No League 7: Lack of signups was cited as the board decided to discontinue L-7, which has operated the past two years for players 70 and over on Tuesday mornings at the Complex. (L-1 fields nine teams for players 70 and older on Monday mornings.) The board felt that those who have signed up for L-7 could play in the 60+ L-2, which plays at 9 a.m. on Tuesdays and/or 60+ L-6, which plays at 10:30 a.m. on Tuesdays, or apply to play in L-1 on Mondays.

Signup Report: Player Agent Linda McCollum-Greene said only 35 players had signed up for L-7, compared to 47 for L-6 and 72 for L-2. L-7 Commissioner Larry Campbell was not at the meeting but was said to feel that getting 48 players to field four teams would be too big a problem. While L-2 has just enough players signed up for six 12-player teams, a total of 72,

McCollum-Greene said L-1 on Mondays is filled up for a nine-team league, with 119 signups who include some non-playing managers or coaches. L-3 (Tuesday night) has 76 signups, including 10 women, four more players than needed for six teams, so there will be a waiting list established.

After Jan. 15, returning applicants lose their seniority status to guarantee that they can play in the leagues of their choice.

Signups for the Wednesday (L-4) and Thursday (L-5) leagues have been slow enough to require the league commissioners to phone players from 2010 rosters who had not signed up. Each league had 59 or 60 applications for 2011. Last year, they had 66 players in each of these leagues, McCollum-Greene said.

Since September, the club has had 25 new members sign up, with the current roster (as of Jan. 10) exceeding 510, compared to 477 as of last Oct. 1.

Sponsorships: First Vice President Dick Latimer reported that 24 team sponsors have paid for 2011, which he called "a good start." He said he had verbal commitments from five or six others, so the number is about 30. He reiterated that gathering sponsorships is a "team effort" that involves all club members. Anyone knowing a potential sponsor should pass on the information to Latimer (363-9555). (MORE)

Golden Seniors Batting Leaders

LOBATO BATS .833 TO LEAD CLUB IN 2010

Five players hit .800 or higher in 2010, led by Emilio Lobato's .833, the highest batting average recorded by a Golden Senior in at least the past five years.

Leading Trudy Smartt's Maita Chevrolet to the L-3 championship, Lobato's average topped the .829 posted by Bill Christian of L-4 in 2008. Lobato also paced L-4 in 2010 with a .779 average. (Note: Christian was hitting around .850 for the regular season but saw his average slip during the playoffs.)

Four others to reach the .800 plateau in 2010 were Dale Stykel (.809) of L-7, Jack Wabinga (.808) of L-3, Rich Edwards (.805) of L-2, and Don Jackson (.800) of L-5. Edwards and Jackson joined Monte Miller (.800 in 2007 and .826 in L-4 in 2008) as the only two-time .800 hitters during these five seasons. Edwards hit .817 in L-2 in 2009, when Jackson hit .812 in L-4.

Doug Peterson, who hit .828 in L-6 in 2009, led L-6 batters in 2010 at .755.

Just 12 players have hit at least .800 in the past five years for a combined total of 15 times. Other .800 hitters since 2006, according to statistics maintained by scorekeepers Sandy Begg and Colette Barnes: John Lack (.818 in L-2 in 2007), Bob Del Chiaro (.817 in L-4 in 2007, Dave Vargo (.800 in L-2, 2008, and Rich Ganas, . 800 in L-5, 2009. (Note: L-1 has not maintained individual statistics.)

The club's top home run hitter in 2010 was Gary Holmes, who tallied seven in L-5. In L-4, Dave Raydon's six included one that cleared the fence. Lobato had five HRs in L-4. The club-wide season high for homers is 10, established by A.J. Petruzzi of L-6 in 2007, when Bobby Flink had nine in L-2. Monta Litle and Rich Ganas hold the record for L-5 homers with nine, in 2007 and 2008, respectively, and Litle also holds the L-4 mark, nine, in 2007.

The club's top RBI man in 2010 was Steve Casarez of L-3, with 60, five more than Monte Miller drove home in L4, but four fewer than Miller's club record 64 for L-4 in 2009. L-5's Allen Riker led the club in total hits with 66, tying his club record for hits set in 2009.

Of the three leagues worked by scorekeeper Barnes, Dave Raydon, making a comeback from a severe heart attack several years ago, registered the highest OPS, which Colette says she and her husband, Russ Barnes, devised as a measurement of offensive success. Raydon's OPS of 1.061 in L-4 is based on at-bats in games played by taking slugging and on-base averages and dividing by 2. (MORE)
