L-1 CHAMPIONSHIP: NIELSEN EDGES DUMONT WITH FINAL-INNING RALLY

In a real nail-biter, Manager Norm Blackwell's Nielsen Real Estate scored a come-frombehind 15-14 victory over Dumont Pest Control in the L-1 championship game at the picnic on Sept. 24. George Langan's Dumont squad took a three-run lead into the bottom of the seventh, as the lead changed hands about four times.

Nielsen came back with two runs and had two on and two out when Aaron LaDay was intentionally walked to load the bases. Nick Abrams lined a single over the third baseman's head to win the game and wrap up the Monday Morning Championship.

To get to the final game, Nielsen, the winner of the league's second round, beat third-round winner American Medical Equipment, managed by John Chatfield, 13-6 on Sept. 19.

Dumont, the first-round winner, played Bob Benham's Merrill Bookkeeping, winner of the most games in the season without winning a round. Dumont held a 6-2 lead going into the bottom of the seventh inning, when Merrill had three straight singles. Ed Caluza cleared the bases with a hit that rolled to the fence. Caluza was thrown out at the plate, failing by one step of achieving a grand slam, and Dumont advanced to the picnic.

Commissioner's notes: Monday Morning had a really good season (aside from the rainouts). Once the season started we never had one rule change and only one protest. The weather was great, always below 100 before the games ended. Four of the nine teams made the playoffs with three tied at 6-2 for the third round. Of the three playoff and championship games, two were won by one run.

Depending on signups for 2012, Monday Morning has nine managers and eight or nine sponsors ready to go at Howe Avenue. #

SANSONE AND LOW ARE HONORED WITH AWARD OF MERIT FOR 2011

Tom Sansone, who has served the club as player agent and team manager, and is the new club president, and Henry Low, former club secretary who has continued to keep the club's records by maintaining the membership data base on his computer, were honored with the 2011 Award of Merit.

The committee of former winners of the award, which for many years was known as the club's "Man of the Year," selected this year's winner that were announced at the club picnic on Sept. 24. The Award of Merit is awarded annually to a member who volunteers time and effort for the betterment of the club.

Bob Havrilla introduced the winners at the picnic. (Low, a University of Washington grad, was absent, as he usually attends a Huskies football game on Saturdays this time of year.

Sansone, 63, joined the club in 2002. Low, who turned 73 on Sept. 24, has been a member since 1994. #

LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP GAME WINNERS: NorCal Jackets, RE/MAX, Harper Properties, Executive Limo, Better Softball Equipment

Three of the five Tuesday-Wednesday-Thursday leagues' championship games were decided by two runs or less in an exciting day of Golden Seniors playoffs Sept. 24 at Howe Park.

The L-5 (Thursday night) championship game featured the top seed, Mark Cordell's NorCal Jackets, against Darryl Watson's Cal Energy, with NorCal prevailing 13-12. Pete Ward's two-out bloop hit drove in the winning run, capping a six-run bottom-of-the-seventh rally for NorCal, after Cal Energy had rallied for seven runs in the top half of the inning to go up by five.

In L-3 (Tuesday night), top-seeded RE/MAX, managed by Dave Tanner, edged Bob Jones's Fuddruckers, 14-13, on the strength of a bottom-of-the-seventh, four-run rally capped by Myron Dahl's game-winning hit to center field. The Fuddruckers had taken a three-run lead in their half of the seventh.

L-2 (Tuesday morning) -- Harper Properties 14, RAMBIT Inc. 12. Harper Properties, with Myron Dahl filling in as acting manager for Jim Wait's second-seeded team, edged the John Colletto-managed, top-seeded RAMBIT squad, including sponsor Ray A. Merrill. Dahl reported that subs Merv Mill and Bill Enos were big additions to the team, and Bob Dillon provided key hits. Dahl, who played in three championship games, winning two, said he was totally exhausted and upon getting home he took his temperature: 101 degrees. Mill, Dillon and John Fields also were among those who played on two leagues' championship teams, according to Dahl.

L-4 (Wednesday night) -- Executive Limousine 21, 9th & X Self Storage 15. Manager Jim Stokes's Executive Limo capitalized on fielding lapses and in the top of the seventh broke the game open with eight runs. Bud DeSouza's 9th & X team couldn't manage a baserunner in the bottom of the seventh. DeSouza and Walt Strickland were 4 for 4 in the game, including a homer from Strickland. John Fields and Darrell Heim had four hits each for the winners. "My first championship, ever!" Stokes said. He has been in the club 14 years, seven as a player-manager.

L-6 (Tuesday morning) -- Better Softball Equipment 16, Mark E. White DDS 11. Managers Howard Toder, 4x4, and Bill Greene, 3x3, paced the winners. Arnold Bray had five singles for Greg Leurgan's Mark E. White team that rallied for 10 of their runs in the last two innings. #

SAFETY REPORT: TRAINING WILL BE OFFERED IN FEBRUARY; NEW SAFETY COORDINATOR NEEDED

The club is scheduling a safety training session for February, as previously announced by Curtis Holcomb, who is helping to recruit a successor as club safety coordinator. Curtis was elected Club Commissioner in August.

A number of previously certified CPR/AED providers need to take refresher courses to retain Red Cross certification, and the club needs additional volunteers for the "red hat" group. The training is financed by the club. Stay tuned for more details. #

CAMPBELL SEEKS L-7 PLAYERS

Larry Campbell, commissioner of the club's League 7, is the contact for players 67 and older interested in playing in a four-team league planned for 10:30 on Tuesday mornings at the Complex. Campbell can be reached at 485-4843.

L-7, initially formed in 2009, also played in 2010, but was suspended for 2011 when there were not enough signups for a four-team league. Campbell said he is hopeful that there are a number of players 67, 68 and 69 who feel that L-6 (also at 10:30 on Tuesdays for players 60 and older) is too fast and would rather play in a league with older players. Campbell said that those who sign up for L-7 could revert to L-6 or another league, or get refunds, if there are insufficient L-7 signups. He said that inviting players 68 and 69 would be intended to make up for players 70 and above who choose to play in L-6. (Note: The club board on Oct. 17 decided to set a Jan. 9 deadline for L-7 signups to make a determination on the viability of the league for 2012.)

Campbell also has organized a league for players 75 and older. He said this league has played successfully at Carmichael Park on Thursday mornings. It is not affiliated with the Golden Seniors Softball Club but he said he is grateful that the club has made surplus GSSCS jerseys available for these teams.

Campbell also said women 45 and older are welcome to play in the Thursday Carmichael Park league. It is only fitting, he said, that women be invited to participate because when the Golden Seniors got under way in the 1970s, they played women's teams. #

GSSCS BOARD APPROVES TEN FOR LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Meeting Oct. 17, the board approved 10 Golden Seniors for life membership status. They are to be inducted at the general meeting in January -- tentatively scheduled for Jan. 9.

The 10, who will be between the ages of 75 and 81 during 2012, are: Lewis Abrams, Leo Curry Jr., Casper Greif, Robert Havrilla, Jerry Kanenaga, Ramiro Luna, Bob Nevis, August Niklas, Vic Spahn and Wayne Vickery.

Other club news from the board meeting:

RULES COMMITTEE: Club Commissioner Curtis Holcomb advised the board that he has three volunteers so far to serve on the Rules Committee: Jerry Nevis, Dave Tanner and Jerry Toenyes. Nevis plays Tuesday mornings and Tanner and Toenyes play Tuesday nights, with Tanner managing RE/MAX and Toenyes serving as L-3 commissioner. The board expressed particular interest in a review of existing playing rules to make them as clear and unambiguous as possible.

GENERAL MEETINGS SCHEDULE: Tentatively, pending confirmation of the availability of the meeting place (VFW Post 67 Hall), the board intends to schedule general meetings for 7:30 p.m. on the second Mondays of January, February, March, May, July and August. A meeting in September will be scheduled to install the new board that is elected at the August meeting. Club by-laws require at least six general membership meetings during the year.

NEW MONDAY LEAGUE COMMISSIONER: Henry Low will be the commissioner of L-1 in 2012. He said George Hodsdon will continue as the Monday League commissioner through the draft of teams for the next season, then will serve as Low's assistant.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: As of Oct. 8, the club roster listed 470 members, including 62 who had joined the club since September 2010. There were 134 life members, 71 of whom play and 63 in non-playing status. There were 104 multi-league members filling 238 slots on teams. Henry Low, who maintains the club's data base, noted that 57 members in 2010 did not renew for 2011. #
