MONTE MILLER'S .844 IS HIGHEST BATTING AVERAGE IN LAST SIX YEARS OF GOLDEN SENIORS PLAY

MILLER LEADS CLUB IN 2011 WITH .844 BATTING AVERAGE, HIGHEST IN PAST SIX YEARS FOR ALL GSSCS LEAGUES

Monte Miller hit .844 to lead all Golden Seniors in batting during 2011 and in the process registered the highest GSSCS average over the past six years. In League 5 (Thursday nights), Miller was 65 for 77 as his average topped the .833 of Emilio Lobato in L-3 during the 2010 season. (Scorekeepers have kept batting statistics since 2006.)

Miller was one only three players to break the .800 mark in 2011: Shawn Rogers hit .818 in L-5, and Lobato paced L-4 with an .809 mark. It was the third season that Miller has hit .800 or better (he also hit .800 in 2007 and .826 in 2008). No other player has done this more than twice, with Lobato joining Rich Edwards and Don Jackson as two-timers. Just 13 players have hit at least .800 in the past six years for a combined total of 18 times.

Other .800 hitters since 2006, according to statistics maintained by scorekeepers Colette Barnes and Sandy Begg: John Lack (.818 in L-2 in 2007), Bob Del Chiaro (.817 in L-4 in 2007, Dave Vargo (.800 in L-2, 2008), and Rich Ganas, .800 in L-5, 2009.

Doug Peterson hit .828 in L-6 (2009), which was bested by Bill Christian's .829 in 2008. Besides Lobato in 2010, four others were in the .800 club that season: Dale Stykel (.809 in L-7), Jack Wabinga (.808 in L-3), Edwards (.805 in L-2) and Jackson (.800 in L-5).

(Note: L-1 does not maintained individual statistics.)

The club's top home run hitter in 2011 was Bill Greene (8 in L-6), while Joe Cors had 7 in L-2 and Jeff Massengale had 7 in L-5. Note: Extra-base hits were not counted in L-3 and L-5 while the scorekeeper was seriously ill for some games in July.

The club-wide season high for homers in one league is 10, established by A.J. Petruzzi of L-6 in 2007, when Bobby Flink had nine in L-2. Monta Litle and Rich Ganas hold the record for L-5 homers with nine, in 2007 and 2008, respectively, and Litle also holds the L-4 mark, nine, in 2007.

Greene had at least 13 homers in 2011 -- 8 in L-6, 3 in L-4, and one each in L-3 and L-5. The club record for multi-league homers in one year is 18, set by Monta Litle for two leagues in 2007. (See Page 2)

NEW 2012 LEAGUE COMMISSIONERS

Henry Low has agreed to succeed George Hodsdon as L-1 commissioner, effective after the player draft for 2012 teams Hodsdon will serve as assistant commissioner.

Dave Vargo has stepped up to serve as L-2 commissioner, succeeding Curtis Holcomb, who has been elected as club commissioner.

RULES COMMITTEE. Led by co-chairs Jerry Nevis and Dave Tanner, the club's Rules Committee met on Nov. 14 and made a number of recommendations to the board. The board decided to seek more information from the committee before considering such proposals as eliminating the run-through rule, allowing sliding, eliminating the automatic out zone between third and home while still calling out any runner who interferes with the catcher.

Among other things, the committee generally wants to club to substitute default rules as Senior Softball USA instead of ASA, which caters to younger players. The impact will be fewer GSSCS rule variations and greatly reduced size of the rules pamphlet, according to Dave Vargo's recap of the more than four-hour meeting attended by four league commissioners, the chief umpire and players from all seven leagues.

Chief Umpire Tom Bussey advised the Rules Committee that ASA has decided to sanction such high-performance bats as the Miken Ultra II -- but limited their use to games in which a lesser-performance ball is required. While Sacramento Softball Complex officials were to be queried on this development, Golden Seniors board members on Nov 14 expressed doubt that the development would be popular with club members who would rather not play with so-called "mush balls" with much softer 300 compression, even if allowed to use hot bats. #
