# HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT HAVING TO RUN AN EXTRA 20 FEET FOR AN INSIDE-THE-PARK HOMER?

The game has been changing... improved bats, better balls ... and now, five more feet between the bases.

How do you feel about the switch from 65 feet to 70 feet between bases? This issue will be discussed at the next general meeting, May 13, reports Tom Sansone, GSSCS president, in his April email report to the membership. The meeting begins at 7:30 p.m. at the VFW Post 67 hall on Stockton Boulevard.

The distance between the bases was changed by Senior Softball USA. The club decided to begin using SSUSA rules in 2012 unless the club adopts its own rule on a particular subject.

SSUSA has exempted games between teams of players 75 and over from using 70-foot bases. The GSSCS Monday league of players at least 70 has elected to stick with the 65-foot base paths.

Sansone noted that the increase in offense has been dramatic since hotter bats have been allowed in 2010, citing a recent analysis of batting statistics in L-2 on Tuesday mornings for players 60 and older. Batting averages have increased by 45 points for the entire league. Some players have increased their batting averages by over 100 points. And slugging percentages also increased.

Obviously, the extra five feet between bases has resulted in more outs, including double plays. Many runners have been thrown out trying to gain an extra base.

"This change has also allowed the infielders to play back five feet which gives them that fraction of a second more to make a play off one of those hot bats. Yes, the game has changed again but this time in favor of the defense," Sansone wrote in his email. NEXT GENERAL MEETING: MAY 13, 2013 7:30 P.M. VFW HALL 2784 STOCKTON BLVD.

"Are these changes good ... or bad? Everyone has an opinion and the club would be interested in hearing yours. ... Think about this change and come to the meeting (May 13) to express your thoughts.

"In the meantime," Sansone said, "we will play with the 70-foot base paths and experience the impact it has on our game. Only then will we be able to fully discuss the change and determine the club's ongoing policy."

#### Other club news:

Sansone noted that Pete Ward, after resigning as second vice president, has continued to work on getting the uniforms prepared for teams with new sponsors. Ward, who has done a great job as second vice president for many years, said he realized that he could not put the club in a bind to get jerseys for numerous newly sponsored teams. Sansone said he is fully aware of the great job Pete has done and how important his service has been to the club. Ward was a driving force to improve quality of balls and the style of uniform jerseys and hats.

**Forty Sponsors.** Dick Latimer, first vice president, reports that he has gathered enough sponsors for the club's 40 teams and is already working on adding new sponsors for 2014. Ten new sponsors have been signed up for this year, requiring the printing of team names and numbers on jerseys with colors that fit in so you can tell the teams apart. Sansone said Ward, who used to run an athletic apparel business, prodded the new printer to accelerate the process.

**Contracts** have been signed, Sansone reported. He said the games at Howe Park cost \$52 each while the games at the Complex vary depending on the day or night, ranging from \$57 for each Tuesday day game to \$65 for Tuesday and Wednesday nights and \$91 for Thursday nights. Figure in the costs of umpires and scorekeepers (\$25 and \$12 respectively) and you can see the total cost per game.
