# **NEW LEAGUE 7 UPDATE**

#### From L1 Commissioner Henry Low

As mentioned in the August Dugout Chatter, a new Monday League Seven (L7) for players age 70+ will be added for our 2014 season. This "transitional" league will target the more skilled players in the 70+ age group and will be limited (by draft) to four or five teams, so as to minimize any impact on our current League One (L1). For players age 70+ currently playing in leagues 2 through 6 signing up for L7, the major transition items will be **65-foot base paths**, **11 players on defense and no "hot bats."** There may be some other different rules, but those will be determined by the L7 commissioner and managers. Both L1 and L7 will play on Monday mornings and thus each league will be a source of substitute players for the other league as currently is the case for L2 and L6, which play on Tuesday mornings. This new L7 will be on the applications for 2014, which will be mailed to all current club members in late September or early October.

Based on the surveys of players in all of our leagues, who will be age 70+ next year, there is a lot of interest in this new league for players in the 70+ age group. However, until players have made their choices and signed up for L1, L7 or both leagues we can't determine how many teams there may be in each league. Also, the number of teams may determine whether these teams can continue playing at Howe Park or may have to move to the Sacramento Softball Complex. Current thinking is that L1 would play the early games and L7 would play the second games at which ever park we decide to play. This is consistent with our thinking that it would be great to have all 70+ players playing at the same park on the same day; because logically the L7 players would eventually migrate to L1, if they are not already playing in both leagues.

Back in August I requested that if anyone had a question or a reason that the new L7 should not be added, that they submit it to me so it could be considered and answered/responded to.
