#### 2015 SEASON CLOSES WITH PLAYOFFS, THE NEXT GENERAL MEETING **PICNIC AND A NEW BOARD WITH MONDAY IN JANUARY 2016** URGENT ISSUES TO ADDRESS

The Golden Seniors Softball Club of Sacramento wound up the 2015 season on Sept. 5 with five league championship playoffs, a picnic and the swearing in of a new board of directors by outgoing president Tom Sansone, turning over the reins to Bill Hill.

Hill, among seven club directors elected to onevear terms at the August general meeting, takes over as the club will try to attract more players in their fifties for night leagues. Another thorny issue is devising a schedule for 2016 that winds up with a Saturday picnic with all leagues -- day and night -- having league championship games at the Sacramento Softball Complex.

The board was scrambling to work on a 2016 budget and produce player application and renewal forms and get them into the mail. Also on the agenda was whether to allow younger players in at least one night league. A committee was set up to make recommendations.

Sansone completed his fourth year as president and Hill, a former president who has served as picnic chairman and team sponsor, was nominated from the floor in July after no one stepped up to run for president.

The club has three directors returning -- 2nd Vice President Chuck Knutson, Treasurer Don Wall, and Player Agent Dave Tanner. Besides Hill, the new board members are first VP Rocky Wilkerson, Secretary Deanne Sesso, and Club Commissioner Bobby Ellison. (See Page 2)

#### NEW BOARD FACES ISSUES (FROM PAGE 1)

The new board will be working with a committee, led by Dan Norton, a former club president, that was exploring strategies to bring in more players in their 50s and 60s to fill out night league rosters.

At the picnic, Sansone was applauded for his four years of service as president. He, in turn, thanked a number of people who helped along the way, a list too numerous to mention here. Among major changes while he was president was growth of the club by providing additional day leagues for players 70 and older. The club also increased opportunity for women by lowering minimum age for women by five years in each league. There was a perennial struggle to recruit enough players for the Wednesday and Thursday night leagues, with club leaders pulling out the stops to keep all night leagues in play.

Sansone also advanced the club's communication capability through use of email "blasts" to members who provided email addresses, so they could be alerted to meeting dates and important developments, including surveys of members on various proposed changes.

Ellison said he will try to hammer out a 2016 schedule for the club's 37th year that minimizes conflict with major senior softball tournaments while consolidating the league championship games at one site, coinciding with a picnic.

The club in recent years moved the picnic to Howe Park where the smaller fields could handle day league championship games. Night leagues have held their playoffs at the Complex on their regularly scheduled nights. However, there is growing desire for the club to consider moving the picnic back to the Complex to have enough fields for eight league title games, including night leagues that require larger fields.

Another factor involves a reasonable agreement at the Complex, including whether the club can use an outside caterer. Further complicating the task is the availability of the Complex on a Saturday in September.

Stay tuned for future developments on these issues, as well as the strategies to bring in more Wednesday and Thursday night leaguers. #

#### **REST IN PEACE TOM WATWOOD**

**Tom Watwood**, longtime player, team manager and umpire, passed away on Aug. 29 in hospice care after he was diagnosed with Stage 4 cancer -- soon after recovering from a heart attack. News of his death stunned and saddened club members and teammates, especially since he had just survived a heart attack.

Tom, 75, joined the Golden Seniors in 2007 and, in his final league draft early this year, selected the Jolly Rogers team that won the L7 championship on Sept. 5.

There were moments of silence in his memory in the Sacramento softball community, including the Thursday Sierra Valley league and at the Howe Park fields where he played in two Monday leagues.where he played.

Club members also were told by President Tom Sansone that **Jim Wait**, 73, a member since 2002 who managed and played on Tuesdays, was hospitalized with a stroke suffered within days of the season's end. #
