WET FIELDS DELAY SEASON OPENERS; SEPT. 17 PICNIC IS SET

Rain-soaked fields delayed the start of some Golden Seniors league play in March but did not dampen enthusiasm as the club launches a new year of slow-pitch softball in eight leagues.

At the March 14 general meeting, Club President Bill Hill announced that the Sept. 17 date for the season-ending picnic has been "re-confirmed" for Howe Park in conjunction with day league championship games.

The night leagues will have their championship games at the Sacramento Softball Complex on dates that coincide with their regular night schedules.

It was announced by Club Commissioner Bobby Ellison that leagues 3, 4 and 5 playoffs will involve "IF" games to assure a true double-elimination format. No longer will the league top seed be eliminated with one loss. If that team is defeated, there will be a second game.

The board of directors also is looking to move two weeks of play for the Tuesday day leagues to Elk Grove during May when the Complex is occupied with major tournaments. This has worked well in the past for day leagues but cannot be done for night leagues because the various venues have rec leagues at nights. (See Page 2)

Other news:

Safety. Hill announced that Glenn Cummings has stepped up and volunteered to serve as the club's safety commissioner. Glenn will be working with the Red Cross to coordinate CPR-AED (defibrillator) training. Stay tuned for further announcements.

Picnic Committee and Awards Banquet or Dinner-Dance. Hill issued a call for volunteers to serve on a committee to take charge of the club picnic. He also would like to explore the idea of a season-ending awards dinner-dance for all leagues. He emphasized that that picnic will continue at Howe Park in conjunction with day league championship games, but he wants to reduce its cost (\$4,000) by changing the menu and restrict consumption of club-supplied beer to a one or two beers to go with a hot-dog or hamburger. Night league all-star games are a possibility at the picnic, and all leagues are invited. The season-ending banquet would be designed to recognize all league championship teams and other club awards. Stay tuned for further details.

Sponsors. Club 1st VP Rocky Wilkerson said new sponsors include Cool Kettle Corn, Wurm and Frye Wealth Management, Laurie Honshu DDS and La Rosa's Sports Cafe. Jersey colors were still being matched up with teams in some leagues.

Late Signups. The Wednesday night (L4) and Thursday night (L5) signups have continued to come in, albeit late, which complicates league drafts. Club Commissioner Ellison said those who sign up late will be placed on teams for four-week trial periods before permanent placements are made in the interest of parity among teams. L5, for example, just got seven new signups, and is almost at 12 players per team. L4 has 10 per team with more people signing up. The board will explore ways to encourage earlier signups in the future, such as reduced fees for "early birds."

Equipment. 2nd VP Chuck Knutson reported on the work that has been done to make sure balls, jerseys, etc., are ready for the new season. Assisted by Bob Smartt, Knutson has arranged for members to purchase club sweatshirts (\$30). In addition to newly designed caps, the club is providing visors. Knutson said more needs to be done to retrieve balls that are hit over the fence at the Complex. He noted that 120 balls were hit over the fence plus 50 more that went over in foul territory during 2015. Efforts will be made to unlock gates so the balls can be easily recovered.

Knutson said he also is still looking for a volunteer to serve as club archivist to examine materials in storage and decide what needs to be moved to a more appropriate location. **Thursday 75+ League.** The GSSCS board has been asked by Larry Campbell to recognize the Thursday morning (75 and older) league at Carmichael Park as a GSSCS "affiliate" without costing the club anything. While the board ponders the request, Hill said the Thursday league's news and announcements can be reported in the Dugout Chatter newsletter and the club website can include a link. Players include many Golden Seniors life members and others who have played in the club. Games are 9 a.m. and 10:30 a.m.

Water at Complex. At this time, the city has determined the water at the complex is nonpotable and therefore the restaurant cannot open due to county health regulations. *Players are advised to bring their own drinking water to games until further notice.* Note: Bathrooms are useable and hand-washing stations have been set up inside both bathrooms. #

REST IN PEACE: JIM WAIT, DOLORES ROSE TURNER

James Grant Wait, who suffered a severe stroke shortly after the 2015 season concluded, passed away on March 2. Jim was 74 and was a Golden Senior Softball Club player for 13 years, including years when he managed a team. He was a line-drive-hitting, sure-handed infielder who "loved playing softball, and played several times a week with a bunch of the world's greatest guys," wrote Jim's wife, Patty, in an obituary published in the Sacramento Bee with a photo of Jim at bat. He also played with the Sacramento Blues tournament team and in the Sierra Valley League. Jim served in state government, retiring as chief deputy director of the State Fire Marshall Office. He also volunteered to make sure the Dugout Chatter would arrive in members' mailboxes. Many of Jim's softball teammates were among the large turnout at his March 13 memorial service.

Dolores Rose Turner, wife of Life Member Bill Turner, passed away on Feb. 11. She was 96. Bill and Dolores were married 74 years. She was a two-time cancer survivor who died after a long illness.

A torn rotator cuff has sidelined **Joe Cors**. He was hurt making a throw from the outfield in St. George, Utah, last October and has undergone surgery. Joe said he might be able to do some soft-toss exercises in July or August and plans to come out and watch some Tuesday morning games. He also is on the Omen 70s roster and will serve as a coach this season.

Good news from **Terry Hennessy**. The CEO of Senior Softball-USA announced March 10 that his surgery was successful and doctors have determined that what they originally thought was cancer on his hip was a stress fracture. He is resuming his duties as leader of SSUSA and plans to play ball this year. He urged support of the CAN-Sirs organization and the needs to for early diagnosis and treatment of cancer, especially prostate cancer. #

Today, when our Club has grown to eight leagues during the week, and young women have little or no women's leagues in the mornings, they can now join the Geezer league.

This makes it possible for family members to play together on the same team as husband and wife (John & Anita Lack), fathers and daughters (Bob Nielsen & Erica), mothers and daughters (Linda McCollum-Greene, Tara and Andrea), grandfathers and granddaughters (Larry Campbell, Jessica and Sydney), uncles and nieces (Jerry Moore & LaVona Miller), etc. All of these combinations are currently playing on Thursday at Carmichael Park at 9:30 AM or 10:45 AM.

Our first games included the rarest double play in memory. The batter hit a high pop fly that was "heading" for the pitcher's area; it hit the pitcher on the top of his head; bounced 8 feet straight up in the air; and was caught by an infielder before touching the ground; then doubled off the runner who went to second when he saw the ball was not caught on its first "landing."
