HERE IS A TRUE GSSCS IRON MAN: JACK JACINTO

Jack Jacinto is the Golden Seniors' Iron Man. He joined the club in March of 1980 so 2018 will be his 39th consecutive year of club membership. According to club records, checked by Player Agent Dave Tanner, no one has been a member longer than Jack.

On top of that, he is still an active player. In 2017, he played in 70-and-over League 1. He also had signed up for L8 (75 and over) but with 15-player rosters, he wasn't needed, and he also had been ill before the season. Thus he needed a courtesy runner from home.

On Nov. 26, he turned 90, to become the oldest rostered active player in the club.

"Jack has signed up to play in the new League 9 for 80-and-over players, and he will be the ripe young age of 91 in 2018," noted Tanner. "When you start thinking of a 55-year-old who plays in four leagues as an 'iron man,' stop and think about Jack. We all have a long way to go."

Jack said he is grateful that the club finally formed a league for 80-and-over players as he feels he is almost is too old for that group. Actually, he said he remains in "decent shape" after retiring 35 year ago from the California Highway Patrol. He loves to fish. And, since taking it up when he was 42, he enjoys slow-pitch softball. He said he still has all his original parts (except he uses hearing aids). He works out at a gym several times a week and, during the winter, has batting practice on Tuesdays and Fridays at Howe Park.

His secret of longevity? He said he has a gin with ice and garlic-stuffed olives daily, before dinner. And he has pretty good genes. His siblings have lived into their 90s and even 100.

On behalf of the club, Tanner said, "Thank you, Jack, for your commitment to GSSCS and to senior softball. We wish you many more seasons with the club." #

KESNER LEADS ALL GOLDEN SENIORS HITTERS IN 2017

Tim Kesner paced the Golden Seniors Softball Club's 2017 hitters with a scorching .860 batting average in League 6, tying the eighth-highest batting average since statistics began to be recorded in 2006.

Here are the regular-season league batting champions:

League 1 — Steve Gellerman .839; L2 — Hal Kastner .818; L3 — Bill Greene .797; L4 — Richard Reisinger .859; L5 — Anthony Maze .797; L6 — Tim Kesner .860; L7 — Chuck Knutson .741. (Note: L8 did not compile statistics.)

Besides Kesner, four others — Richard Reisinger (.859 in L4), Steve Gellerman (.839 in L1), Hal Kastner (.818 in L2) and Hal Johnson (.814 in L2) joined the .800 club in 2017. Johnson joined Emilio Lobato as a three-time .800 hitter. Jarvis Quenga, Bob Scollard, Mick Tursky, Dave Vargo and Jack Wabinga are two-time .800 hitters. Don Jackson, Rich Edwards and Monte Miller have reached the .800 level the most, four times. First-time .800 club members this year are L6 leader Kesner, L4 leader Reisinger, L1 leader Gellerman, and L2 leader Kastner.

Mick Tursky continues to hold the club record of .903 (L2 in 2014). It was threatened by Rick Cady's .891 in 2015. Rich Edward's .882 in 2012 ranks third.
