DUGOUT CHATTER

GOLDEN SENIORS CLUB DIRECTORS MOVE AHEAD WITH FACEBOOK PROJECT AND REDESIGNED WEBSITE TO ATTRACT MORE MEMBERS; SET DRAFTS FOR NINE LEAGUES

Looking to the Internet to help boost membership, directors of the Golden Seniors Softball Club of Sacramento are launching a Facebook project and redesigning the club website this year.

The board, at the Jan. 8 general meeting, continues to prepare for seasonopening games the week of March 19, coinciding with Howe Park and the Sacramento Softball Complex's start of their spring leagues.

Club leaders urge returning players to sign up, particularly for the night leagues, and help recruit new players. For some reason, the younger night league players seem to drag their feet, while the club's veteran members are quicker to get their applications filed.

Team drafts were tentatively scheduled on March 5, 6 and 7 for the three night leagues and Feb. 23 or March 2 for the day leagues, Club Commissioner Bob Ellison announced. He also said pre-draft workouts will be scheduled in late February so managers can evaluate new players.

Club President Bill Hill announced that the club is going ahead with the creation of a Facebook Page to help boost club membership. As previously reported, Bob Kunnman is working on the Facebook project that will be focused on a demographic of prospective senior softball players in the region.

The club's website needs to be redesigned and it is hoped the club can keep the (www.gsscs.org) domain. If agreement cannot be reached for control over the current domain, a new website will need (SEE PAGE 2)

to be created. A club member or committee will be tasked with keeping information current on the website.

Membership unanimously approved the club's budget (\$79,062) for the fiscal year that runs through September 2018. Club Treasurer Don Wall said the budget reduces the club's reserve — or rainy day fund — to the \$35,000 range. Included are \$2,500 for the Facebook project and a \$2,500 donation to the Softball Complex for dugout shade covering.

Other club news:

Lagging Signups. Player Agent Dave Tanner said L3 (Tuesday night) had only 13 signups, while L4 (Wednesday night) had 27 and L5 (Thursday night) 18. They are envisioned to field six teams each.

Just two leagues (L2 and L6 on Tuesday mornings) have in excess of 60 signups and appear to be set for six-team leagues. The two (70+) Monday morning leagues at Howe Park have enough signups for four teams each. The new L9 (for players 80+) had 39 signups and looks like a four-team circuit. (Note: women can be 10 years younger for the leagues.)

Tanner said he expects an additional 200 players to sign up and about 30 percent will be playing in more than one league.

Need for Sponsorships. Rocky Wilkerson, club 1st vice president, said he plans to send mailers to auto dealerships and others to recruit more team sponsors (\$255 per year or \$450 for two years) and he asks members to call him (595-2541) if they know of prospective sponsors. The club budgets \$8,550 from sponsors, without which members would have to pay \$30-35 per year, Wilkerson said. The revamped website and new Facebook page may provide more opportunities for sponsor advertising.

Equipment. Bob Smartt, club 2nd VP, said the club will save money by limiting new hats to new members or those whose caps are so worn that they need replacing. Many members note they have closets full of GSSCS hats from many years. Members may still request bucket-style hats. Members are not required to wear hats but if they do, they must have a GSSCS logo. Smartt also said the club will be using improved Trump Stote balls that will have the same performance standards but will be better able to withstand cold or wet weather. These are the balls that Senior Softball USA has announced will be used in its 2018 tournaments.

Rules. Ellison said he would hold a meeting in January for league commissioners and interested managers to discuss possible rules changes for 2018. No major changes were anticipated but there could be clarifications.

League Commissioners. Ellison said he has lined up commissioners for all leagues except the new L9 on Tuesday mornings for players 80 and over. Last year's commissioners of the other leagues are returning with one exception: L7 will be led by David Vargo.

Next General Meeting: The Feb. 12 meeting (7 p.m. at the VFW Hall on Stockton Boulevard) will feature the induction of the Life Members Class of 2018. The club will provide pizza, cake and soft drinks.
