More than 300 members, spouses and guests enjoyed the BBQ picnic at the Sacramento Softball Complex. During a brief club general meeting, the membership approved the board's proposal to donate \$2,500 to the Complex to provide sun screening for the players' team benches at one of the fields.

The club also had a successful raffle, with 50 percent of the proceeds going to the Complex concessionaire's staff who served the lunch.

Hill thanked the picnic committee, led by Secretary Sesso, for their hard work that paid off with a successful and enjoyable event. Thanks to Debbie Towne, wife of Steve Casarez (L3) and Frank Lamar, player and Tri-C sponsor (L3 & L4) for sponsoring dessert cakes for the picnic. It was the first picnic/playoffs Saturday at the Sacramento Softball Complex in a number of years.
